WetlandsLIVE: A Distance Learning Adventure is a project for students promoting conservation action through education and awareness. The objectives are to:

- Increase understanding of wetlands and their importance.
- Increase understanding of the many important wetland functions (as nurseries, stopovers for migratory species, water purifiers, erosion control, etc.).
- Help students understand the international connections of wetlands.
- Encourage schools and classrooms to learn outside and take action to help wetlands.
- Increase participation in and understanding of citizen science programs related to wetlands.
- Learn the importance of being a good steward.
- Understand the role of citizens, public land management agencies, and non-governmental organizations in protecting and conserving habitat.
- Develop positive relationships with international partners.

TIPS FOR SHOOTING VIDEO

- REGISTER and CHECK OUT THE WEB SITE at <http://WetlandsLIVE.pwnet.org>. This project is highlighting wetland ecology, bird and fish migration, and service learning. Is there something special about a wetland near you that you would like to show? We can talk about topics and technical requirements to help make your video successful.
- CHOOSE A SPECIFIC TOPIC.
Some topics could include:
 - How is your wetland connected to a migration flyway?
 - How is this wetland important for birds, fish or other wildlife?
 - Why are wetlands are important?
 - What is important and/or special about your wetland?
 - How is your wetland managed to support wildlife (for example, fish, birds or other wildlife)?
- LIMIT YOUR VIDEO TO 2 TO 4 MINUTES (think YouTube style).
- CREATE AN OUTLINE.
- COULD YOUR VIDEO BE USED FOR OTHER PURPOSES?
